# What is the cost of an online certificate or degree program?

### **Online Program Overview**

A typical semester will be 16 weeks, or two 8-week terms. Most of your classes will follow the term model, but occasionally, there will be times when courses run the full duration of the semester. This is more typical for on-campus classes, but can happen in the online program as well.

You can expect most classes to run asynchronously with posted lectures, assignments, and often a discussion board. Some professors may include instructional videos, resources, or may require a virtual meet-up for their students if necessary to the nature of the curriculum.
