GENERAL EDUCATION ASSESSMENT

As the Engaged Citizenship Curriculum (ECC) moves toward its sunset, faculty need to continue identifying artifacts for assessment in ECC courses. At the end of this fall, the Student Learning Improvement Committee (SLIC) will need instructors to submit artifacts from classes with the following designations: **The Arts** (AR), **Historical Perspectives** (HP), and **Collaborative Leadership** (CL). As you complete your syllabi for these classes, be sure to indicate any assignments you will forward to the committee for assessment of related student learning outcomes (SLOs). Also, for any courses designated in Simpson Core, be sure to identify assignments associated with SLOs for **Foundations**, **Inquiry**, **Mission**, or **Engaged Learning** courses. We will prompt students late in the semester to upload appropriate artifacts to their Portfolium accounts. SIMPSON COLLEGE GALLERY OF ART AND DESIGN


Showing at Simpson College Gallery of Art and Design:

NEH Workshop at Iowa State

The National Endowment for the Humanities (NEH) Regional Workshop on September 27, 2023 in Ames. The workshop is free and will be held in person from 8:30 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. at the Iowa State University Memorial Union, room 3560. This workshop will be led by Dr. Claudia Kinkela, a Senior Program Officer in the NEH's Division of Research who has served as the team lead for the NEH Fellowships Program for over a decade. Dr. Kinkela will introduce NEH funding opportunities, provide tips for writing a successful application, and talk indepth about NEH Fellowships, which has been her main area of focus for the past 15 years. Time will be available for a Q&A session after the presentation, and a free lunch will be provided. Individual 15-minute sessions with Dr. Kinkela are available and will be scheduled between 2:00 p.m. and 5:00 p.m. and are available on a first-come, first-served basis.
