FACULTY ACCOMPLISHMENTS

Dr. David Foshee, Assistant Professor of Spanish, published his article "Migration and Capitalist Spectacle: Imagining the Child as Waste in *Icebox* (Sawka, 2016)" in the journal *Letras Hispanas*, (vol. 19, no. 2, 2023, pp. 67-78).

Jeremy Griffin, Assistant Professor of English, was recently awarded the 2023 Black Lawrence Press Hudson Prize for his short fiction collection "Scream Queen." The book will be released in October 2024.

Mark Pleiss, Director of the Center for Teaching & Learning, and Nick Proctor, Professor of History, presented "Upgrade New Faculty Orientation with The New Faculty Game" at the Professional & Organizational Development (POD) Network Conference in Pittsburgh, PA on November 16, 2023.

Spencer Waugh, Director of Exploratory Studies, received the E.R. Nichols Award from Pi Kappa Delta at the National Communication Association National Conference in Washington, DC last month. This award recognizes outstanding contributions to the discipline of intercollegiate forensics (speech & debate). It is also awarded as recognition for excellence in teaching.

Maeve Callan, Professor of Religion, "'The Mary of the Gael': The Blessed Virgin among Saints and Heretics in Medieval Ireland" was just published in *Mystics, Goddesses, Lovers, and Teachers: Medieval Visions and Their Legacies* (Brepols Press, 2023).

John Walker, Associate Professor of Management, published his <u>case study</u> in Harvard Business Publishing and the North American Case Research Journal last fall. John also received notice that he was selected as a 2023 Tate Award Finalist for the best case published in the Case Research Journal. This is a great accomplishment as CRJ publishes around 60+ cases every year and is highly selective on the number of cases submitted versus published (under 20%).
