**13<sup>th</sup> Annual Culver Lecture** -- **John Della Volpe**, Director of Polling for the Harvard Institute of Politics and author of *Fight: How Gen Z is Channeling their Fear and Passion to Save America* 

## Thursday, April 4, 2024, 7:00 - 8:30pm

The John C. Culver Public Policy Center has secured <u>John Della Volpe</u>, Director of Polling for the Harvard Institute of Politics and a former colleague of Senator Culver's at the Harvard IOP, to deliver the annual Culver Lecture on the evening of Thursday, April 4, 2024. *The Washington Post* has referred to Della Volpe as one of the world's leading authorities on global sentiment, opinion, and influence, especially among young Americans and in the age of digital and social media. His most recent book, *Fight: How Gen Z is Channeling their Fear and Passion to Save America*, draws on his extensive youth public opinion research and focus group work over the past two decades plus.

In this presidential election year, Della Volpe will explore the contours of youth political views and engagement as Gen Z emerges as a dispositive voting bloc in American elections. Please consider adding the Culver Lecture to your spring syllabi and offering your students extra credit for attending.
